As we come to this final service of the year with our advent theme, 'Out of the ordinary and Scratching beneath the surface'. Today's New Testament reading from Luke's Gospel is the account of Jesus' mother and father bringing him to the Temple like all the other children for purification and to present him to the Lord. Simeon was sitting and waiting, a generation apart, and took Jesus in his arms and began to praise God.

Down through the years I have benefited from worshipping with different people, especially when we have met in an ecumenical setting. I have had the privilege of teaching for many years in a Cathedral school and working as a Chaplain and teacher in a boarding school, where I worshipped with many people from across the world.

We have the opportunity to learn from others around us and I value the time I spend with people listening to their stories, including their faith stories. This year I have been to various places as my role as mission enabler encouraging Harpole with their fish and chips lunches, Kingsthorpe with their third Friday lunch club and the Park Avenue Monday lunch and not forgetting the Great Billing and Astcote, Scones of Praise.

As I reflect on my life and how blessed I am to have seven grandchildren as when I was young, I did not imagine that I would be married and have children. Our three sons are now grown up and even now as a dad and a grandpa, I am learning from them and my daughter in laws. In our lives we don't stop learning and our lives are richer for that.

We all live in different communities with people of all ages and perspectives. You and I are unique, like pieces of a jigsaw puzzle, when we put the pieces of a jigsaw together, we can see the full amazing picture. Aristotle said "The whole is greater than the sum of its parts', serving God and moving forward together we impact our communities.

Finally, what is our legacy going to be in the Methodist Church? I was speaking with someone the other day who said that at 3 Generate in Birmingham it was like a giant picnic, similar to the

scene of Jesus feeding the 5000. Some have reported back having had a great experience, with some children returning, asking for help in worshipping and creating gatherings in their home community. Next year wouldn't it be fantastic to have children from Northampton go to 3Generate in 2024: 4 - 6 October at the NEC, Birmingham. Just maybe, we will hear God in and through the young people in our Churches.
