2 Timothy Chapter 1 verses 1-14

Luke Chapter17 verses 5-10

Reflection

In Pauls 2nd letter to Timothy, it sounds as if Paul is concerned that Timothy is losing his enthusiasm for the gospel. Part of Pauls encouragement is to remind Timothy of the faith that came in the context of Timothy's mother and grandmother being part of the early church in Lystra. For many of us this will chime with our lived experience – another person, or people, brought their enthusiasm for the gospel to us and then supported us in our faith journey. This may or may not be about genetic family, but certainly feels like a familial group.

The verses we are given in the lectionary for the gospel reading today, are more complex than Paul's message to Timothy. The disciples ask Jesus about faith and he tells them a story about a slave. Today slavery is such a painful idea that we can struggle to understand the meaning Jesus might have been trying to convey to his contemporaries.

Slavery was woven into the fabric of the society Jesus lived in and was, therefore, unremarkable to his listeners and the writer of the gospel. Commentaries think that Jesus was emphasising the normality of someone doing the task they were expected to complete. Not a great deal of faith was involved in fulfilling tasks that were part of everyday life. Disciples do not need great faith to follow Jesus. By implication, neither do we. Gods love is available to everyone and we can all find some small amount of faith to start, or continue, our journey with God.

The Roots material for this week asks us to focus on "belonging". Being part of a community called church, helps us to sustain and to grow our faith. Last Sunday the Methodists in Northampton came together to worship and affirm the beginning of Northampton Methodist Church. 10 worshipping communities agreeing to find ways to work together for the good of all. We walk together in faith.

Prayers of intercession

We remember today all those who are in despair. In particular, we think of those who believe that their suffering will never end, those who see no way out of a desperate situation; and those who have given up hope. In comparison, the things for which we hope seem so trivial. We seek more faith in order to achieve our vain desires, but please help us to grow faith of a different kind –faith that overflows into service for the good of others, that asks for the sake of others and not ourselves. And to those in despair, grant faith to sustain them in their time of need, we pray. Amen.
