Time to reflect:

Jesus talks to the crowd and shares a parable about a builder. In this story we often focus on the builder, yet Jesus says right at the start, the wise person who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice, is like a wise man who built his house on the rock.

All through life people feel battered by the storms and the place of refuge for all of us is knowing God's love in difficult times. In Psalm 46 David says God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble. Therefore, we will not fear, though the earth gives way, and the mountains fall into the heart of the sea, though its waters roar and foam and the mountains quake with their surging.

When I was at Bible College we lived in Belfast and one evening while we were sitting in our home the windows and doors began to shake before we were plunged into darkness for an hour or so. My uncle was staying with us at the time, and he was surprised at our calmness, it was nothing new to us, it meant another bomb had exploded in the city. The next morning, I went into the city centre and saw that the theatre walls were blown in and there was a burnt-out car and there was cladding and debris on the ground outside the Europa hotel. In all the buildings around, the foundations were shaken, and some walls had crumbled.

At the end of the Sermon on the Mount Jesus shares a parable about having a firm foundation. The wise builder who had built his house on a rock withstood all the storms, but the house the foolish builder built on the sand, did not survive.

I remember as a young boy building sandcastles with my grandpa and then later with our three boys putting a wall around a sandcastle trying to battle the tides. We had hours of fun; however, the incoming tide and the sweeping waves always won the battle. As the tide retreated it left a sandy beach and its golden sands, all level and smooth, as though nothing had happened previously. Over the years I have had different jobs and one of them was working in an architectural company, working on the Cromwell Hospital in London. The foundations were so deep, we had to work with the London underground as the piles needed to be drilled safely to miss the tube network below ground.

In the church we have had an ancient hymn with a verse that says

The Church's one foundation Is Jesus Christ her Lord; She is His new creation By water and the Word: From heav'n He came and sought her To be His holy Bride; With His own blood He bought her, And for her life He died.

As we consider our faith, we can live our lives with confidence when we live according to the word of God. God wants us listen to His word and take action.
